DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

What was the purpose of the Law?

How does your background affect the way you read these words of Jesus?

Why do you think this message is at the beginning of Matthew's gospel?

Which was easier to live by: the Ten Commandments or the Sermon on the Mount? Why?

Jesus discusses 6 moral issues: anger, lust, faithfulness, integrity, generosity, and love. Which of these do you find most difficult to accept and apply?

What is our solution to the moral dilemma that Jesus creates in the Sermon on the Mount? What is God's solution?

PRAYER FOCUS:

Praise God for grace.

Agree with God about the areas where your life falls short of the ideal that Jesus presents.

Thank God for the cross and the resurrection. Ask God to show you how to apply what you've learned.

Where does sin begin? Make & send an "I'm Sorry" card.


