Vs 9-14 - where is your hope?

Who do you identify with in this parable? Why? What Is it that makes it easier to "hope" in accomplishments? In people? In God?

Vs 15-17 – childlike hope

What is it about the hope in children that Jesus admires? How are you childlike?

Vs 18-30 - a hopeful question

What does the rule hope to hear back from Jesus?Who is he like in the parable in vs 9-14?Why is he sad at Jesus' answer?What do you think of Peter's statement in vs 28?Does Jesus' response in vs 29-30 give you hope? Why? Why not?

Vs 31-34 – Is there hope in pain?

Jesus gives a list of things that are going to happen. Is there any hope in this list? Why didn't the disciples see/understand the hope that was to come?

Vs 35-43 – unexpected hope

What hope did the blind man show before he heard of Jesus?

What hope did the blind man show when he heard of Jesus?

Have you seen hope in the people you meet?

How does this chapter help you with see the similarities and differences between what you would describe as hope and faith?

SCRIPTURE REFERENCE/STORY: A FRIEND AT MIDNIGHT - LUKE 11:5-13 AND THE PERSISTENT WIDOW - LUKE 18:1-8 READ the scripture, stopping to make note of ALL of the following: THINGS/NOUNS: friend; midnight; 3 loaves of bread; visitor; judge; widow; ACTIONS: getting out of bed; ask/receives; seek/find; knock/open; begging/asking; IDEAS: inconvenience; justice; wearing out/down; What is the LESSON THEME, or GOAL that you want the kids to learn? God does not give to us because we annoy Him. He loves us and wants to give us what is best. MEMORY VERSE: "Blessed are your eyes because they see, and your ears because they hear." Matthew 13:16 "Ask and it will be given to you, seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Luke 11:9 SONGS: FRIEND Seek Ye First GAMES: Boomergang golf? KEY PHRASES: Don't bother me! OBJECT LESSON IDEAS: Luke 11:11-13 - fish/snake; egg/scorpion - Would a loving father do this? CRAFTS: Make a door know knocker like they have in hotels/motels. On one side put "welcome" on the other put "do not disturb!" GROUP ACTIVITIES: Discuss - when do you not like to be disturbed/interrupted? FAMILY ACTIVITIES: Discuss - when do you not like to be disturbed/interrupted? Make up a modern day skit of the story to present. KIDS' THEME: Jesus' story of the two men praying (Luke 18:9-14) -Attitude in worship MEMORY VERSE: "Worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only."
