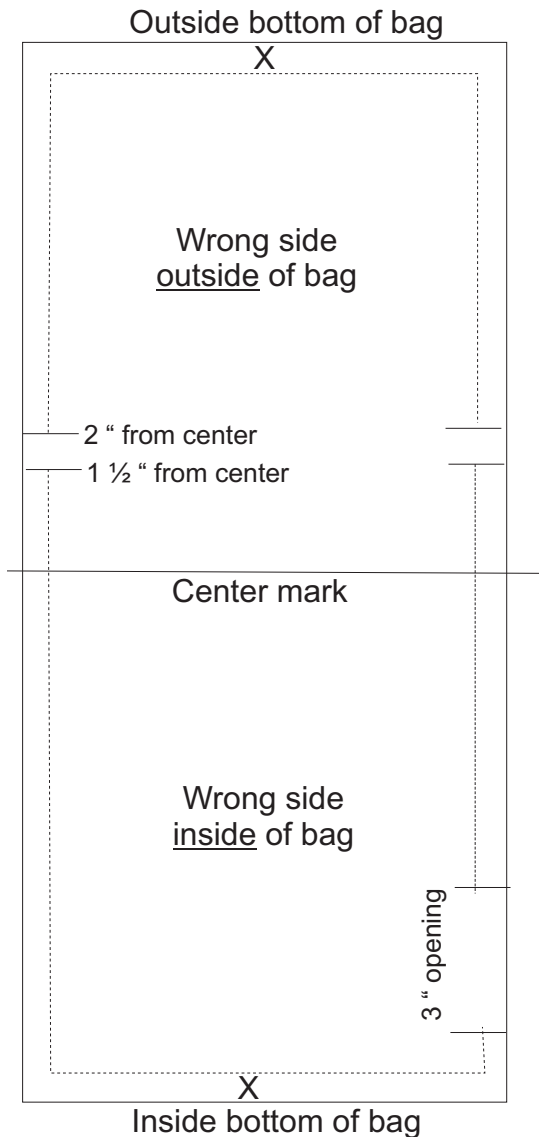


TREASURE BAGS

Cut or piece 2 knit rectangles that are at least twice as tall as they are wide.

Iron and pin them right sides together.

Mark the center.

On the side you want to be the outside (see picture) of the bag, make marks at 1 1/2" and 2" from center along side seams.

Along one side seam of the inside (see picture) of the bag, mark a 3" opening near the bottom for turning.

Stitch around the rectangle, stretching as you sew and backstitching around the 3 marked openings.

Turn bag right side out through 3" opening.

Iron and stitch the 3" opening closed.

Fold the bag into itself (put Xs together), straighten and iron.

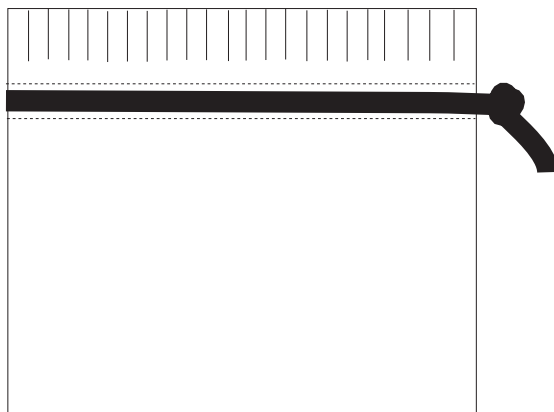
The 1/2" openings should be on the outside of the folded bag.

Topstitch around the top and the bottom of the side openings to form a casing.

Cut a 1" strip of t-shirt fabric and pull it to make it curl into yarn.

Use a safety pin, afghan stitch hook, etc. To pull yarn through casing and tie it into a loop so it won't come out.

If desired, you may cut the areas around the top edge stitching for a fringe.
