

CAPITAL/upper case and LOWER CASE/small LETTERS - tracing pages

Grandma uses the CAPITAL and LOWER CASE LETTER tracing pages this way:

First: Show the student the pictures of the letter you are learning on Grandma's alphabet match game cards.

Be sure to show them both the upper case/capital letter and the lower case/small letter.

Have the student trace the letter on the match game cards with their finger and say the name of the letter.

Add one new letter each day or each week.

Second: Have the student find the letter on the alphabet bingo boards.

Set out 5 to 10 alphabet bingo boards - a mix of both lower case/small and upper case/capital letter boards.

When the student finds a letter, have them say the letter out loud each time they set a chip or marker on a letter. (Note that not all the letters are on every board.)

Celebrate their "find" by singing that letter's song. The words to each alphabet letter's song are on each tracing page. Sing them to the tune of "London Bridge is falling down".

(Repeat the first and second activities until you have gone through all the letters that the student has learned so far. Chips/markers on the bingo boards can accumulate.)

Third: Daily have the student trace the letters on the tracing pages.

Have the student say each letter out loud as they complete it.

If the student no longer needs a complete tracing page for a letter they have learned, have them write that letter on an "I really know this letter well" (page 28 of this file) page.

Fourth: Celebrate for each tracing page completed.

You can celebrate with a star, a cheer, etc. Our 3 year old grandchild likes to be "thrown in the pit" (tossed on the couch or bed) each time she completes a page.

Fifth: When you are all done learning all the letters, you can play Grandma's alphabet match games (both upper case/capital and lower case/small) to help you remember the letters.

When a match is made, celebrate by singing the letter's song!

You can also mix one set of the capital/upper case with one set of the lower case/small letters.

OR you can play Grandma's ALPHABET BINGO games- in both upper case/capital and lower case/small letters.

Sixth: Work on the alphabet sounds by challenging your students to make their own words for letter songs.

Seventh: Play alphabet bingo, but play it with the sounds or songs of the letters.

Say the sound or sing the song of the letter that the student should find and cover with a marker or a chip. Do not use the "draw cards" until the student is ready.
